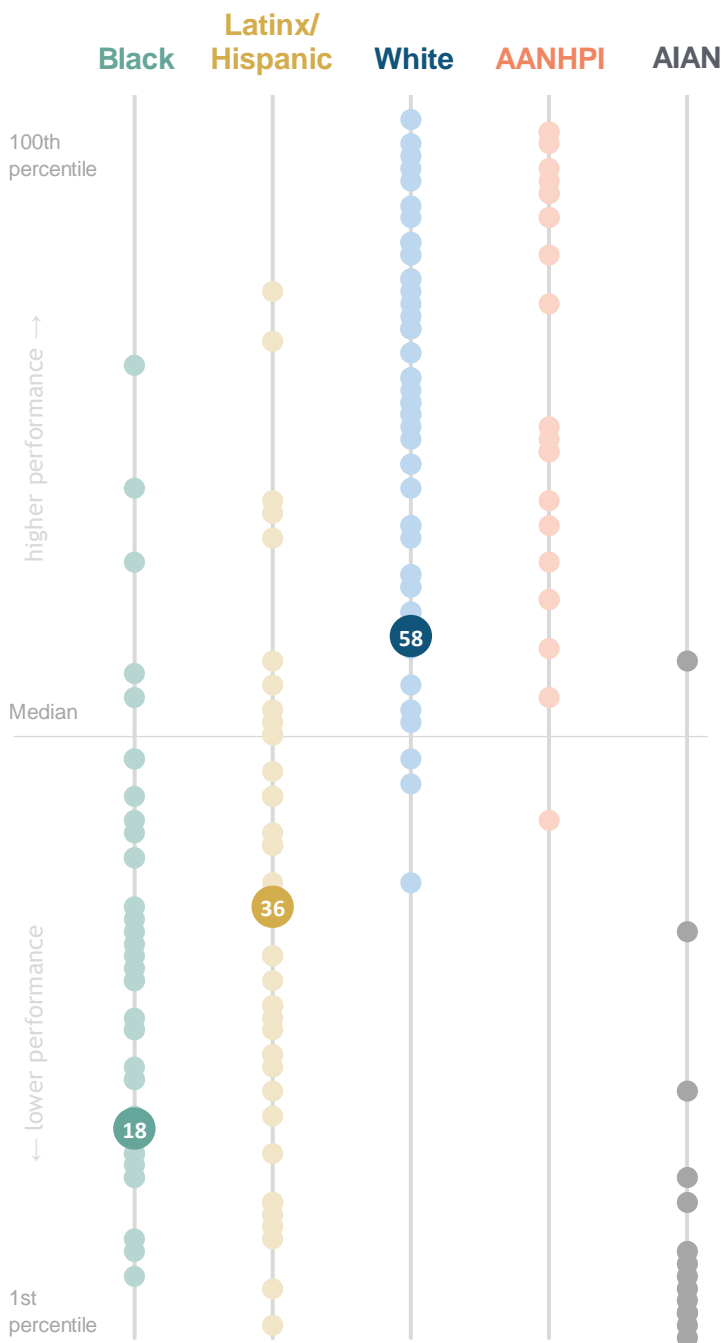


# Health Equity in Louisiana
