


More than one in ten Medicare beneficiaries were under age 65 in 2020

Medicare Beneficiaries, by Gender, Dual Eligibility Status, Age, and Rurality, 2020






One out of every four Medicare beneficiaries lived in California, Florida, or Texas in 2020.

Percent of federal poverty level, 2017



Percentage of out-of-pocket costs for U.S. adults, by age






